**2. James II, the Glorious Revolution and Party Politics, c. 1685-1715**

How far did the Glorious Revolution of 1688 bring about a significant change in the relationship between Crown and Parliament? [40]

**1. Crime, Disorder and Protest, c. 1603-1715**

'The decline in the authority and influence of the Church was mainly responsible for the growth in crime, disorder and protest in the period 1603-1715.' Discuss. [40]

**2. England's changing relations with foreign powers, c. 1603-1715**

'England's relations with foreign powers in this period was influenced more by commercial rivalry than by religious conflict.' Discuss. [40]
